MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Command Policy #5 Alcohol Policy

1. References.
 - a. CENTCOM General Order No. 1C (GO-1C), 21 May 2013.
 - b. 379th AEWI 34-219, 20 August 2013, incorporating Interim Change 1, 4 November 2013.
 - c. Isa Air Base Bahrain Instruction 4651.1D.
 - d. 31st ADA Brigade Command Policy Letter 5, 1 October 2015.
2. Members of this command, regardless of location of duty or any local policy to the contrary, will not consume alcoholic beverages off-installation.
3. Personnel under the age of twenty-one (21) may not procure, control, transport, sell, possess, or consume alcoholic beverages regardless of installation or local laws.
4. Soldiers must discontinue alcohol consumption at least eight hours prior to any crew changeover/assumption.
5. Soldiers may consume only three alcoholic beverages in a 18-hr period.
6. Soldiers may purchase only one alcoholic beverage at a time and may not purchase alcohol for another Soldier. No Soldier will use another Soldier's CAC/ration card to purchase alcohol. Unused daily rations cannot be transferred to another Soldier at any time.
7. The Battalion Commander reserves the right to withdraw individual alcohol privileges at his discretion at any time.
8. Unit commanders will seek Battalion Commander approval to otherwise restrict alcohol consumption by any Soldier, group of Soldiers, or their complete unit. Unit commanders do not have this authority. Leaders will counsel any Soldier upon revoking privileges detailing specific reasons under this policy and the expected time period or

requirements to be fulfilled prior to lifting the restriction. Leaders will counsel Soldiers prior to reinstating privileges on responsible drinking and expectations.

9. Any violation of this policy or incident involving alcohol requires an official report to the Battalion Commander. All Soldiers will immediately correct violations of this policy, and report serious incidents involving alcohol to their chain of command. Leaders will regularly circulate designated alcohol consumption areas and Soldier gathering locations. Leaders must anticipate issues and take immediate corrective action. With active leadership, Soldiers can enjoy safe social environments that enhance personal well-being and organizational esprit de corps
