# Fort Hood Special Weather Statement

**BLUF:** Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible Monday early morning through early afternoon with damaging hail, wind, and localized flooding being the primary threats.

**Weather Watches / Weather Warnings:** Currently there are no WATCHES or WARNINGS out for the Fort Hood Reservation. Fort Hood weather forecasters and the 26th Operational Weather Squadron (Air Force regional weather center) will continue to monitor the situation and issue watches and warnings as conditions warrant.

**SYNOPSIS:** An upper level system will interact with the dryline across the region and will trigger scattered strong to severe thunderstorms. These storms could impact the Fort Hood area as early as 0100L Monday morning with the threat of damaging hail, wind, and localized flooding. An isolated tornado is possible.

**MAIN IMPACTS:** Damaging hail, wind, and localized flooding are the primary threats. Though flooding may occur in the vicinity of low water crossings, prolonged rainfall is not expected.
