- A Net Zero Waste Installation is an installation that reduces, reuses, and recovers waste streams, converting them to resource values with zero landfill over the course of a year.

FAMILY HOUSING RECYCLING

- Recycle containers are: all printable paper products, books, mail, aluminum and steel/tin cans, plastics #1 and #2, cardboard, and paperboard.
- Glass can be dropped off at the Community Centers, the Recycle Center, and the two Commissaries on Fort Hood.



HOUSEHOLD MATERIALS

- Residents contact their Community Centers for additional [recycle bins](#).
- Clear plastic bags can also be used for recyclable material that doesn't fit in the bin.
- Bring [toner/ink cartridges](#), [tennis shoes](#), [pallets](#), [CDs/DVDs](#), [scrap metal](#), [tires with rims](#), [lead acid auto batteries](#), [cooking oil](#), and [sensitive documents](#) that need to be shredded to the Recycle Center.



APPLIANCE AND SCRAP METAL

Household appliances and scrap metal can be taken to the Fort Hood Recycle Center.

- irons, mixers, hair dryers, microwaves,
- toaster ovens, blenders, pots and pans,
- washer, dryer, refrigerator, air-conditioners, etc



BRUSH, LEAVES, AND LAWN CLIPPINGS

- All bagged yard waste such as leaves, trimmings, grass clippings, etc. can be placed in compost bins for curb side pick-up. Contact the Community Center for a bin to be placed at the home.



CLOTHING, TOYS, AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS

- Practice reuse by participating in the semiannual installation [wide yard sales](#) in the housing areas, or donate items to Goodwill (254-699-2311) or the Salvation Army (254-634-0364).



PERSONAL COMPUTERS, PRINTERS, TELEVISIONS, CELL PHONES, ELECTRONICS

- Bring personally owned electronic equipment to [Best Buy](#), [Goodwill](#), or the [Classification Unit on Fort Hood](#) for recycling.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Housing residents can drop-off and pick-up for reuse any **cleaning products**, used paint, pesticides, batteries, etc. to the Classification Unit on Fort Hood.

QUICK TIPS

- Pay attention to what you buy (can it be reused or recycled at the end of its useful life?)

- Utilize reusable bags, water bottles, thermoses, tableware (cups, plates, bowls, and utensils)



- Find ways to reuse materials (yard sales) and donate to Goodwill, Habitat for Humanity, and Salvation Army



QUICK TIPS

- Make recycle points in your home or Barracks next to trash cans and reduce the number of desk side trash cans
- Bring your aluminum cans to the Recycle Center for **\$50 cents per pound**
- Participate in recycle competitions for **Hood Hero Awards**
- Help spread the word about Net Zero Waste – use distro lists and word of mouth to express importance of Net Zero Waste
