READMISSION CRITERIA FOLLOWING ILLNESS:

Children may be readmitted after the treatment has begun, the contagious stage of the illness has passed, the child is physically able to function in the program setting, and the following conditions exist:

- a. Fever has been absent for 24 hours without administering medications (e.g. acetaminophen, ibuprofen). Parents are not allowed to enter CYS programs and give any type of medication that will reduce fevers due to a **contagious illness**. If a Health Care Provider (HCP) has determined the underlying cause of a fever is **not due to a contagious illness**, has prescribed the medication, and has provided a signed/stamped/dated not stating the child is noncontagious, then the child may return and these medications will be allowed (e.g. immunizations, injuries, teething).
- b. Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea has subsided for 24 hours. If a HCP determines that the cause of diarrhea is **not contagious** the child may return to care if all other readmission criteria are met.
- c. Lesions from impetigo are no longer weeping.
- d. Scabies, Lice, and Pinworm infestations have been treated. Pinworms require 24 hours following treatment before readmission.
- e. The child has completed the contagious stage of the illness as determined by the HCP.
- f. Conjunctivitis has diminished to the point the the eyes are no longer discharging.
- g. The appropriate number of doses of antibiotics have been given over a 24-hour period for known Strep and other bacterial infections, the child's physician has approved readmission, and child does not require addition CYS staff to care for him.
- h. Chicken pox lesions become crusted, usually five to six days after onset (the child is no longer contagious).
- i. Children who receive medication for an illness will not be denied readmission if the readmission criteria above are met.
- j. Ringworm treatment can take numerous months; therefore, the child is not denied service once treatment has begun. The ringworm site should be covered, if possible, to prevent direct contact exposure to the other children.
