LIST OF OFF-LIMITS AREAS AND ESTABLISHMENTS

History. This supersedes III Corps and Fort Hood Regulation 600-40, dated 1 July 1997, and all changes issued thereto.

Summary. This regulation lists off-limits areas and establishments for soldiers assigned to or visiting Fort Hood.

Applicability. This regulation applies to soldiers assigned to or visiting Fort Hood. Paragraphs 2a and 2b of this regulation are punitive with regard to soldiers. A violation of either paragraph is punishable as a violation of a lawful general regulation under Article 92, Uniform Code of Military Justice. Penalties for violating either paragraph include the full range of statutory and

regulatory sanctions, both criminal and administrative. These and other provisions of this regulation may also be the basis of commissioned, warrant, or noncommissioned officer to issue a lawful order to a soldier.

Changes. Changes to this regulation are not official unless the changes are authenticated by the Directorate of Information Management
