Assignments, Details, and Transfers
OFFICER/WARRANT OFFICER STRENGTH REPORT

SUPPLEMENTATION. Local supplementation of this regulation is prohibited, except upon approval of AFZF-GA.

SUGGESTED IMPROVEMENTS. The proponent of this regulation is the ACofS, G1. Users are invited to send comments and suggested improvements to the Commander, III Corps and Fort Hood, ATTN: AFZF-GA-OPM.

1. PURPOSE. This regulation establishes a standard report of the authorized/assigned strengths for officers and warrant officers for those units listed in distribution. This report is exempt from reports control under AR 335-15 (Management Information Control System), paragraph 7-2c.

2. GENERAL.

a. FH Form 481 (Officer/Warrant Officer Strength Report) and FORSCOM Form 632-R (Officer/Warrant Officer Strength Report) will be used as a basis for making assignments to Fort Hood units and preparing the bimonthly requisitions sent by MILPERCEN to this headquarters.

b. Report will be submitted in original only on FH Form 481 and three copies on FORSCOM Form 632-R.

3. PREPARATION. Report will be prepared and sent to this headquarters, ATTN: AFZF-GA-OPM, by the 20th of each month.

a. Officer Strength.

(1) Number of officers authorized/assigned by control specialty code and grade.

(2) Known gains by month for 7 months following reporting period.

(3) Known losses by month for 7 months following reporting period.

(4) All promotable officers will be reflected in the grade in which to be promoted (i.e., a major (P) will be counted as a lieutenant colonel).

b. Warrant Officer Strength.

(1) Number of warrant officers authorized/assigned by primary military occupational specialty (PMOS).

(2) Known gains by month for 7 months following reporting period.

(3) Known losses by month for 7 months following reporting period.

c. Critical Shortages.

(1) Officers. List shortages by grade, control specialty code, number authorized/assigned, and number short. Shortages are to be listed in sequence with the most critical listed first.

(2) Warrant Officers. List shortages by MOS, number authorized/assigned, and number short. Shortages are to be listed in sequence with the most critical listed first.
