ADMINISTRATION

SUPPLEMENTATION. Local supplementation is prohibited, except on approval of AFZF-JA.

SUGGESTED IMPROVEMENTS. The proponent of this supplement is the office of the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA). Users are invited to send comments and suggested improvements to the Commander, III Corps and Fort Hood, ATTN: AFZF-JA-A1, Fort Hood, Texas 76544.

AR 210-10, 12 September 1977, is supplemented as follows:

Page 2-4, paragraph 2-23. Add subparagraph e after subparagraph d.

e. No person who has received a dishonorable or bad conduct discharge, or whose dishonorable or bad conduct discharge has been approved by the convening authority, or who has received a discharge from the Army under the provisions of AR 604-10, or who has received an other than honorable discharge under the provisions of AR 635-200, or who has received any type of discharge for a drug related offense, may enter the Fort Hood military reservation without the prior written approval of the Commanding General, III Corps and Fort Hood. The Chief, AG Transition Point, III Corps and Fort Hood, is authorized to sign a permanent bar letter for the installation commander for any person receiving a discharge under the conditions noted above. The permanent bar letters issued by the Chief, AG Transition Point will be in the form shown at figure 1-1, this supplement. The commanders of the 1st Cavalry Division and 2d Armored Division are authorized to sign a permanent bar letter for the installation commander for any soldier in their command whose dishonorable or bad conduct discharge has been approved by the convening authority. The permanent bar letters issued by the division commanders will be in the form shown at figure 1-2, this supplement.

Page 6-2, paragraph 6-4. Add subparagraphs f and g after subparagraph e.

f. In discharging the responsibility stated above, the installation commander directs that:

(1) Picketing, demonstrations, sit-ins, protest marches, and similar activities are prohibited and will not be conducted on the Fort Hood military installation except as provided in paragraph 6-4.

(2) No one shall enter or stay on the Fort Hood military reservation for any of the purposes prohibited in paragraph 6-4f (1). Any entry in violation of this paragraph will constitute a violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1382, which provides in part that:

'Whoever, within the jurisdiction of the United States, goes upon any military . . . reservation, post, fort, arsenal, yard, station, or installation, for any purpose prohibited by law or lawful regulation . . . shall be fined . . . or imprisoned . . . or both.'

(3) Any person who becomes aware that any of the above prohibited activities are planned will notify his/her immediate commander, or unit's staff duty officer if after duty hours, who will in turn notify the headquarters through the chain of command as fast as possible. If such activity is then taking place, or will take place very shortly, he/she will report this fact at once to his/her immediate commander, or unit's staff duty officer if after duty hours. The commander, or staff duty officer, after verifying that such activity is taking place, will immediately notify the Fort Hood Military Police Desk (287-2176), and the III Corps and Fort Hood Corps Operation Center (287-2520). No actions other than the verification and/or observation will be taken. After such notification has been accomplished, a written report of the activity, and the reporting action taken, will be made by the reporting officer to his/her immediate commander for fast transmission to the major subordinate command headquarters.

(4) Upon receipt of notification, the Provost Marshal, III Corps and Fort Hood, will take proper action as outlined in previously issued instructions to insure that law and order is maintained, and to apprehend individuals involved in such activities. The Corps Operations Center will immediately notify the Chief of Staff, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G2; and the Staff Judge Advocate, III Corps and Fort Hood, of the activity.

(5) The Provost Marshal, III Corps and Fort Hood, will coordinate with subordinate commanders and staff officers to assure speedy identification and processing of individuals seized. Nonmilitary people taking part in such activities will, after identification, be barred from the post under normal procedures.

g. Exceptions. The Commanding General, III Corps and Fort Hood, may grant exceptions to the policy set forth in paragraph 6-4f(1). Applications for exceptions shall be sent in writing at least 7 days before the date of the proposed demonstration or other activity. Requests for exceptions to paragraph 6-4f(1) will be sent to the Provost Marshal, III Corps and Fort Hood..


SUBJECT: Bar from the Fort Hood Military Reservation
