Environmental Compliance for Mobilizing or Demobilizing Units

Goal Statement

This briefing is designed to train non-Fort Hood Reserve and National Guard personnel about the Ft. Hood environmental compliance program in order to comply with FH 200-1, Environment and Natural Resources dated 15 July 2004.

Objectives

Upon completion of this 10 minute briefing, Soldiers/Workers should be able to:

- Describe why environmental compliance rules on Ft. Hood may be different than the environmental compliance rules at their home station or when deployed.
 - Regulations are written by the state; therefore the details of compliance will vary.
 - Environmental protection during deployment is managed by either the Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA) or by the Commanding Officer.
- Identify Ft. Hood's Environmental Policy.
 - Stop Pollution
 - Continue Improvement
 - Assure Compliance
 - Leadership Commitment
 - Everyone Involved
- List four locations on Ft. Hood that will help the unit manage environmental issues and describe the sites' important roles
 - Classification Unit, North Ave and 37th, 254-288-7627; turn in of empty containers and unusable hazardous materials as well as reuse of many open/partially used hazardous materials
 - Recycle Center, 72nd and Santa Fe, 254-287-2336; provide recycle containers as well as turn in of recyclables
 - DPW-ENV office, 77th and Warehouse, 254-287-6499; office where ECAT and Training personnel are located.
 - BioSite, 37th and North Ave, 254-286-5993; site to purge fuel tankers, wash MKTs as well as turn in contaminated soil and sweepable absorbents.
- Identify the phone number of the Unit's primary point of contact for Ft. Hood environmental.

- Locate a list of essential environmental compliance rules for Ft. Hood.

- Describe, in their own words, what the repercussions of environmental non-compliance may be.
 - Legal liability, financial liability
