SUBJECT: Personal use of Model Aircraft on Fort Hood

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation (AR) 95-2, Air Traffic Control, Airfield/Heliport, and Airspace Operations, 31 March 2016.
- b. Army Directive (AD) 2012-02, Supplemental Policy for Operations of Unmanned Aircraft Systems in the National Airspace System, 13 Jan 2012.
- c. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Joint Order 7200.23, Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS), 3 October 2016.
- d. Title 14, Code of Federal Regulations, part 91, General Operating and Flight Rules.
- e. Public Law 112-95, FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012; Title 10, United States Code (U.S.C.) Section 892.
- f. Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ)

2. Applicability: This policy applies to all military members, Department of Defense (DoD) civilian employees, invited contractors/technical representatives, dependents, sponsored visitors and employees on the Fort Hood military reservation.

3. The operation of model aircraft on Fort Hood threatens the safety of service members and civilians, and could endanger the safety of manned aircraft. Personnel who observe model aircraft operations on or near Fort Hood should keep them under observation and immediately contact your installation law enforcement organization.

4. For public safety and operational reasons, the outdoor use of model aircraft (including, but not limited to, quadcopters or drones), whether or not these are equipped with cameras, is prohibited on the Fort Hood military installation. This restriction does not apply to the operation of DoD Unmanned Aircraft Systems.
