MEMORANDUM FOR ALL US ARMY GARRISON FORT HOOD PERSONNEL

SUBJECT: Garrison Deliberate Risk Management Policy

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation 385-10, 24 February 2017, The Army Safety Program.
- b. DA PAM 385-30, 2 December 2014, Risk Management.
- c. DA PAM 385-64, Raid Action Review 10 October 2013, Ammunition and Explosives Safety Program.
- d. ATP 5-19, 4 April 2014, Risk Management.

2. Goal: To have Deliberate Risk Assessment (DRAW), DD Form 2977, fully integrated and executed throughout USAG Fort Hood as an instinctive process for all phases of operation to include Ammunition and Explosives operations. The advantages of DRAW for decision-makers are: detects risks before losses, quantifies risks/hazards, provides risk reduction alternatives, encourages better management decisions, assists with greater integration of safety, ensures increased mission capability, and ensures risk decisions are made at the appropriate level.

3. Standard: Leadership at every level must be committed to safety. I expect everyone to promote safety in every activity or operation, and implement and enforce the use of the Risk Management Process throughout your organizational operations in order to ensure that tasks are accomplished to standard without injuring personnel or damaging property.

4. Approval authority for acceptance of residual risks is as follows:

- a. Extremely High: First GO or SES
- b. High: First O6 or GS-15
- c. Medium: First O5 or GS-13/14

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d. Low: First O3 or GS-10 and above
